East Service Award for Graduating Seniors – Cumulative through High School

This award is granted to graduating seniors with more than 150 cumulative hours of service during high school (summer before freshman year through March 31 of senior year). The intention is to make recognition for service attainable for busy high school students, yet lofty enough to demonstrate a sincere passion for serving fellow students, the community and our world. The award will be recognized and a special cord issued at graduation ceremonies.

Presidential Volunteer Service Award -- Annual

This is a national program that recognizes students who demonstrate outstanding service to their community, nation or abroad on an annual basis during the 12-month period between **April 1, 2021** and **March 31, 2022**. Requirements by age are as follows:

For students age 16 or older as of March 31, 2022, the awards are:

Gold: 250 or more hours of service

Silver: 175-249 hours **Bronze**: 100-174 hours

For students under 16 as of March 31, 2022, awards are:

Gold: 100 or more hours of service

Silver: 75 – 99 hours **Bronze**: 50 – 74 hours

What activities qualify for service hours?

- Time spent helping others (inside & outside SME) that you don't get paid for, don't get a grade for and isn't a condition of your membership in a club/sport/organization.
- Fundraising for community and faith-based services
- Travel time and actual work time on volunteer trips
- Examples within school include: NHS hours, Link Crew involvement, SHARE projects, Coalition projects, STUCO service activities, student boards you serve on for betterment of the school, and tutoring.
- Examples outside school include: time you give to any non-profit organization (fundraising or hands-on service), service to faith-based and civic organizations, tutoring, coaching and teaching others in your neighborhood and community (as long as it is not paid).

What doesn't count?

- Fundraising for sports teams, choir, theater, clubs, etc. in which you're involved
- Court-ordered community service
- Sleeping and entertainment time after you traveled to the volunteer location
- Services performed as defined by your role as a member of a club or team, i.e. player, manager, actor, technician...
